(Her)men·you·tics is a podcast at the nexus of rhetoric and theology. Professor Johanna Hartelius (University of Texas at Austin) co-hosts along with Rev. Jason Micheli (Annandale United Methodist Church) and Rev. Teer Hardy (Walker Chapel United Methodist Church). Taking on one concept per episode and letter of the alphabet, they explore and disagree on the language of faith and the prospect of "speaking Christian" without stained-glass language. That they are life-long friends brings some levity and plenty of profanity to the mix.

(Her)men·you·tics is a series produced by the <u>Crackers & Grape Juice</u> team, whose programs also include <u>You Are Not Accepted</u> as well as reading groups, Substack publication series, and hundreds of interviews with authors, scholars, and leaders.

The Crackers and Grapejuice team is collaborating with the <u>lowa Preachers Project</u> led by Professor Ken Sundet Jones at Grand View University, funded by a Compelling Teaching Grant from the Lilly Endowment. This collaboration aligns rhetorical sensibility, theology, and homiletics in a year-long fellowship workshop.

All of the series, reading groups, and interviews produced by Crackers and Grape Juice are designed for public audiences. Dr. Hartelius adapts the theoretical frameworks and arguments from her research to be accessible to a general audience. The conversational format is engaging to people who seek a sustained, in-depth exploration of the Christian faith in an informal (funny) space, a meeting of friends.

As noted in the description, Dr. Hartelius's work with the podcast is a prime example of the kind of engaged research wherein a rhetorical scholar partners with community members. Our pod team collaborates with <u>Mockingbird Ministries</u> and other communities of faith. Our <u>book</u> publications are accessible to general readers.
